



In June's Light


A Walk in November's Shadows

novels, you will travel alongside characters shaped not by the loveliness of June, but by the profound, shadowed introspection that only November can inspire. This is especially true of my protagonist, Jane Gray Wharton, in *The Grays of Truth*, and the empathetic Emily Lloyd in *Veil of Doubt*. And whether you love him or loathe him, the brooding Armistead Mason in my first book, *Masque of Honor*, exudes the bone-chilling darkness of a late autumn night, forcing those in his circle to face their worst fears.

But my protagonists—Jack in *Masque*, Powell in *Veil*, and Jane in *Grays*—are survivors: bright lights shining through the miasma. With strength and perseverance, ultimately they find their way. I invite you to join them on their journey to June. I promise it's a ride you'll remember long after the final page.




The Inspiration of Selma

It is amazing how our surroundings inspire our lives. For me, there is no better inspiration than a historical place or old building, and I am so blessed to actually live in one!





by Amy Harmon (4.6)



by Sara Donati (4.5)




Historical Fiction Book Club


